CURATORIAL NOTE

LUBNA SEN

A mark is a perceived anomaly created on a surface, born out of the gestural activity of its maker. These anomalies or impressions are made, not accidentally, but with intention. There is a purposeful attention to regulate the flow of energy and matter to create something. In other words, a mark is not just about its outward appearance, it also holds an inward significance. It bears a distinct personality of its maker and a unique context behind its creation. An artist's journey can be discovered from the "mark" she / he makes – both literally and figuratively.

The group exhibition "MARKS" explores the practices of five contemporary artists through this lens - Moti Zharotia, Ananda Moy Banerji, Dattatreya Apte, Kavita Nayar, and Sushanta Guha. The title, which is also an acronym derived by creatively manoeuvring the artists' first names, fits the theme perfectly. This group, known to the art world as 'Multiple Encounters', has been engaging in many collaborative projects around the world with a singular commitment to create a deeper dialogue in art. The show will give us an opportunity to discover them individually - What differentiates them from the rest? And how have they made their "mark" in the world?

The show can be considered an anthology of mark making, a rich repertoire of expressions arrived through a distinctive array of techniques evolved through three to four decades of individual practices. Though vastly different in style, they converge at one point – their single minded commitment to the evolution of their craft.

While the intricate tonal variations bear the signature style of Moti Zharotia's serigraphy; using the same technique as an overlapping layer over woodcuts and etchings create a variety of interest in the works of Ananda Moy Banerji. In Dattatreya Apte's intaglios, a variety of hatching techniques are used to create chiaroscuro, while the same is achieved in the work of Sushanta Guha through lithography and etching aquatint. Kavita Nayar creates completely different impressions with etchings, which complement the rugged texture of her works on paper in the same theme.

But "MARKS" is not just about the physical impressions created, it is about getting an insight into the life energies behind them. The nuances of life, nature and spirituality is the central idea behind Moti Zharotia's 'Purush and Prakriti' and 'Tree' series. Dedicated to narrating human landscapes, Ananda Moy Banerji uses the river as a metaphor to depict the rhythm and pace of life in 'River Sutra'. Dattatreya Apte's 'Still Life' and 'Reflections' series are quiet contemplations of the unseen and unacknowledged world around us. Kavita Nayar's 'Pathless Path' and 'Mayhem' series, although seem to be a detour from her usual explorations, are really an extension of her inward journey projected outwards, on the way to the larger issues of mankind. Sushanta Guha's critical commentaries, 'His Magical World Series' and 'Time Traveller', are a forewarning of the dystopian future that awaits us if we continue with this systematic destruction of human values.

In the end "MARKS" attempts to project an artist as a unitary being, in continuous interaction with the inner and outer world. Through intuitive, but purposeful, impressions created with a set of tools and techniques, an artist strives for inner harmony and balance. It is yet another opportunity for us to appreciate that the history of markmaking is nothing but a tale of human "becoming".





BIOGRAPHY

After completing his B.F.A in Painting from College of Art, Delhi, and M.F.A in Printmaking from Kala Bhavana in the environs of Shantiniketan, Ananda Moy Banerji has been to Camberwell College of Art and Craft, UK, to complete his research associateship in the area of autographic printmaking. He has worked in various mediums and techniques, and has taken a keen interest as well as participated in major art national/ international activities including - many Annuals, Biennials and Triennials; specially Xth Triennial, India. Banerji's works have been part of all major exhibitions, and festivals through India and also in other countries-like U.S.A, UK, France, Norway, Russia, Germany, Japan, Korea, Nepal, Bangladesh, Egypt and China to name a few. Banerji is a recipient of many awards including, National Academy Award, Lalit Kala Akademi, New Delhi; A.I.F.A.C.S, New Delhi; Charles Wallace India Award and Nagasawa Art Park Project Award. His works are in collection of many major galleries, institutions and museums in various countries including N.G.M.A, New Delhi. He has attended and organized various art camps and workshops including "Mois des L'estampe" in Paris; Lalit Kala Akademi, Indian Printmakers Guild, Multiple Encounters and other organizations. He keenly participates in various seminars, lectures as a speaker on Art and Aesthetics. He is a Founder member of 'Indian Printmakers Guild', & 'Multiple Encounters'. At present Anandamoy Banerji is working as Academic Dean and Vice Principal at South Delhi Polytechnic for Women, New Delhi. He lives and practices art in Delhi-NCR.

CONCEPT NOTE

When thematic concern becomes an important issue for an artist, it manifests itself in the form of an interlinked series of images. The artist's role as an active commentator has inspired me to create works that look closely at structures of the society and the individual. The change from the isolated rural canvas of Shantiniketan to the urban chaos of Delhi, had a direct impact on my work. All of my series – "Today", "Temptation", "Performers", "Reflections", "Entwined", "His/Her World" and "River Sutra" - no matter whether they are constructed to be political, social, religious or romantic - are an attempt to explore universal feelings and relations between – "Man and Man". My latest series "Multiple Encounter" is a conceptual and technical amalgamation, where the word itself is the subject and develops a relation between all forms.


The work River Sutra is, not only a work of art for me, but a jouney of life itself. This composition of various forms of figures do suggest that theme. The complete and incomplete forms reflects various phases, and the encircling lines flowing around the complete work (a set of five) represent water or river in one way is our source of life, and on the other hand – this flow only takes us through varios stages, levels, experineces too. It also represents the birth and death of all forms of living beings.

"River is the ultimate journey --- river sutra"







RIVER SUTRA - I | 2019 | Woodcut and Serigraph on MDF | 60 x 36 inches




RIVER SUTRA - II | 2019 | Woodcut and Serigraph on MDF | 60 x 36 inches




RIVER SUTRA - III | 2019 | Woodcut and Serigraph on MDF | 60 x 36 inches




The Orange Moon | 2018 | Serigraphy | 16 x 22 inches

BIOGRAPHY


Dattatreya Apte, born in Sangli, Maharashtra in 1953, studied Drawing & Painting in Pune, 1974, and Printmaking at Faculty of Fine Arts, M S University, Vadodara, 1980. Besides ten one man shows and many national and international participations, he has also received National Academy Award in Printmaking, 2004; Honorary mention at Bharat Bhawan International Print Biennale, Bhopal, India, 2002; Charles Wallace India Trust Award to work under the guidance of Prof. Jacki Parry at Glasgow School of Art, Scotland, UK, 1999; All India Fine Arts and Crafts Society Award, 1996 and Senior Fellowship – Ministry of Human Resources Development, Visual Arts, 1995. Apte has been a founding member of Indian Printmakers Guild from 1990 - 2000, organized workshops and Printmaking Exhibitions in many cities in India and abroad including Indo - American Print Exhibition in India - 2008, 2012; USA - 2008 and Bangladesh - 2017. He is the Founder member of 'Multiple Encounters' from 2008. Dattatreya Apte is a visiting faculty for printmaking at College of Art, Delhi and lives and works in Delhi-NCR.

CONCEPT NOTE




Colonial Reflections - I | 2019 | Intaglio | 20 x 26 inches




Colonial Reflections - III | 2019 | Intaglio | 20 x 26 inches



Lockdown Reflections - I | 2021 | Intaglio | 20 x 26 inches




Lockdown Reflections - II | 2021 | Intaglio | 20 x 26 inches


Ghost House | 2022 | Intaglio | 9.5 x 15 inches




Stage | 2022 | Intaglio | 9.5 x 14 inches

Kavita Nayar obtained her bachelor's degree from Shantiniketan, West Bengal, in Printmaking followed by Masters in Painting from College of Art, New Delhi. She is a recipient of many awards and scholarships like French Government Scholarship in Paris, Charles Wallace India Trust Fellowship in Oxford, Creative Fund Fellowship and residency in Luxembourg for screen printing, Ministry of Culture residency in Gyor, Hungary, Festival of Printmaking, "Mois des L'estampe" in Paris; and a travel grant to Sweden to work in glass. She received Senior and Junior Fellowship from Ministry of HRD, Research Grant from Lalit Kala Akademi, Honourable Mention in the 44th National Exhibition, invited for 10th Triennial of India, AIFACS Award and many more. Nayar has participated in many workshops in India and abroad, given presentations in various universities and museums in France, England, Sweden, Hungary, Luxembourg, Mauritius, USA, China, Korea, Greece, Bhutan and Bangladesh. She has held number of solo exhibitions in India and abroad. Her works are in collection with Prime Minister House, Panchvati Hall, in New Delhi; Ministry of Civil Aviation, New Delhi; National Gallery of Modern Art, Lalit Kala Akademi, New Delhi; National Bibliotheque, Paris; Otterbien University, Ohio, Korea, Bangladesh, Greece and in many important academies and corporate houses in India and abroad. She is one of the Founder member of 'Indian Printmakers Guild' and 'Multiple Encounters'. At present Kavita Nayar is a visiting professor in College of Art, New Delhi and Trustee of an NGO, Kala Sakshi Memorial Trust (www.kalasakshi.org) which is involved in scholarships and mentoring programmes giving platform to young & deserving students of art from across the country.


CONCEPT NOTE




Mayhem I | 2020 | Oil, pastel and colour pencil on Textured Paper | 11 x 15 inches




Mayhem II | 2020 | Oil, pastel and colour pencil on Textured Paper | 11 x 15 inches




Mayhem III | 2020 | Oil, pastel and colour pencil on Textured Paper | 11 x 15 inches






BIOGRAPHY

Born in 1953, Moti Zharotia completed his graduation in Political Science Honours and earned another graduate degree in Graphics & Paintings from the Delhi College of Arts, Delhi University in 1979. He has participated in many group-shows and camps at both national and international platforms and some of the significant ones are; 'Indian Contemporaries, Art Russia, 2017; 'Kibriya Art Festival', Bangladesh, 2017; 'Tokyo International Mini Triennial', Tama Art University, Japan and 'Contemporary Prints by 65 Indian Artists, by Shilpkala Academy, Bangladesh, 2017. He is a recipient of prestigious awards like The Golden IKCOON Awards, 2017; Hues Exhibition by Kala Care Foundation and American Center, New Delhi. He has participated in the 'Festival of Print Making' Show in Athens, Greece, in 2018. Zharotia was invited for the first International 'Print Biennale Exhibition' organized by Lalit Kala Akademi, New Delhi, in 2018. He has already accredited two Hindi Poetry Books in his name - "Kacche Dhaage" and "Main Hoon Aas Paas", which were published in the years 2015 and 2017 respectively.

CONCEPT NOTE

My present work is fundamentally based on the theme of 'Purusha & Prakriti". The central idea resides in the compatibility of the feminine and masculine energies which are harmonized in a way that confirms the continuity of life. This idea is so vast and explorable that the artist can dig into its vivid dimensions and can come up with innumerable possibilities of expressing the same through silkscreen prints.





BIOGRAPHY

Born in 1960 at Gaya, Bihar, India, Sushanta Guha finished his graduation and post graduation from Kala Bhavan, Shantiniketan in 1982. He further pursued a fellowship by Charles Wallace India Trust Award at Camber Well College, London in 1998, followed by a Fulbright Fellowship at Manhattan Graphic Center, New York in 2003. He had solo exhibitions at Art Consult Gallery and Triveni Kala Sangam, New Delhi. He has participated in important shows in India and abroad like Annual Exhibitions at Birla Academy, Kolkata; Chitra Kala Parishad, Bangalore; AIFCS, Delhi; Bharat Bhavan, Bhopal; 4th International Biennale Caixa, Ourense, Spain, Bapha Varna 97, Bulgaria; Lithuania; Slovenia; Yugoslavia; Pusan City, Korea; Kanagawa, Japan, VII Biennale Internationale de la Gravure D'lle-d-France and Sharjah, UAE. He has also participated in Multiple Encounter 1& 2, Exhibition of Prints at Chandigarh, Biswa Banga Sammelan Millennium show at Kolkata, Indian Printmakers Guild, Delhi and Edge of the Century Art show New Delhi. An awardee of The National Cultural Scholarship, Junior and Senior Fellowship from The Govt. of India, Guha has received National Academy Award from Lalit Kala Akademi, AIFACS Awards from Delhi and Bendre Hussain Award from Mumbai. Guha has been conducting and participating in several workshops/ camps including those at Govt. College of Art, Chandigarh; Nepal Art's Council, Kathmandu, Latymer School, London; "Aaj" Udaipur, Ramkinkar Baij Centenary workshop at Santiniketan; "Homage to Somnath Hore" at Uttarayan Art Center, Baroda; Charukola, Faculty of Fine Arts, University of Dhaka, Bangladesh; Mejott 18, International Workshop at Siwan, Patna. His works have been held in the collection of NGMA and Lalit Kala Akademi, New Delhi, Leicester Art Council, UK, State Museum Majdenek, Poland, New York Public Library, New York, Delhi Art Gallery (DAG), and several other private collections in India and abroad. 
CONCEPT NOTE






White Tiger in the Jungle, Trapped | 2018 | Intaglio | 10 x 11 inches
